STRATEGIC MATTERS

- Mr Jackson Selome has been appointed as Manager: Vaalputs with effect from 1 February 2022.
- NRWDI concluded the Vaalputs Nuclear Installation License application process and is confident that the Vaalputs Nuclear Installation License will be approved and issued to NRWDI in the first quarter of the 2022/2023 financial year.
- The NRWDI CEO met with community members in towns surrounding Vaalputs.







VAALPUTS OPERATIONAL MATTERS

- The following vacancies have been advertise and the adverts will be distributed in towns surrounding Vaalputs:
 - ✓ Three Operator positions;
 - ✓ One Technical Officer: Quality Assurance position; and
 - ✓ One Section Head: Maintenance position.
- Vaalputs was visited by the NRWDI CEO and a NRWDI delegation, as well as a delegation from NECSA on 14-17 February 2022 to meet the Vaalputs Team.



VAALPUTS OPERATIONAL MATTERS

- Two concrete waste shipments (5 containers per shipment) were received from Koeberg for disposal.
- One metal waste shipment (88 containers) was received from Koeberg.
- Two concrete waste shipments (6 containers per shipment) were received from Necsa for disposal.
- All waste packages complied with the Vaalputs Waste Acceptance Criteria for disposal.
- All statutory training for staff is up to date.



VAALPUTS OPERATIONAL MATTERS

- All waste packages were covered with screened clay to comply with the Vaalputs license conditions.
- Statutory inspections were done on all statutory equipment. No non-compliances were identified.
- All quarterly environmental samples were taken as required by the Nuclear Licence conditions.
- All radiological measurements were done in accordance with Radiation Protection programme.
- The NNR conducted their quarterly compliance assurance inspection on 18-20 January 2022.
