CANCELLATION OF THE IN-PERSON VAALPUTS PUBLIC SAFETY INFORMATION FORUM (VPSIF) MEETING SCHEDULED FOR SEPTEMBER 2021

For the past weeks, we have seen a decrease in the number of daily new Covid-19 positive infections. This is an indication that we are near to exiting the third wave of the COVID-19 pandemic.

I want to convey my sincerest condolences to those who have lost loved ones in this pandemic and my thoughts are with everyone who has suffered personal or financial hardship during this difficult time.

It is up to every one of us to play our part to ensure that the spread and effects of the virus is limited as much as possible. We must abide by the COVID-19 protocols by wearing masks, maintaining our social distance from other people and sanitizing regularly.

Our overriding priority is the safety and health our workers and valued stakeholders. As a safety precautionary measure to contain the spread and infection rate of the COVID-19 virus, Vaalputs Management has therefore deemed it prudent and responsible to cancel the physical in-person Vaalputs Public Safety Information Forum (VPSIF) meeting that was scheduled to take place in September 2021.

Management has also assessed the option of conducting a virtual VPSIF meeting but due to the remoteness and the limited or non-existent Wi-Fi connectivity in the area, this option is not deemed feasible and viable because many of the communities surrounding Vaalputs will not be able to participate in such a virtual VPSIF meeting.

As an alternative to providing feedback on Vaalputs safety matters in either a physical or virtual meeting, Management opted to make the information available in hard copy format to all members of the Vaalputs Public Safety Information Forum meeting that was scheduled for September 2021. The information is attached for your perusal.

VAALPUTS OPERATIONS

- Mr Marius Farmer has been appointed as Acting Manager: Vaalputs with effect of 1st January 2021 until further notice.
- One Administrative Officer and one Chief Operator were appointed at Vaalputs.
- Awaiting on the appointment of the Manager: Vaalputs, Chief Technical Officer, Section Head: Maintenance, RP Supervisor, Senior Operator and the Stakeholder Liaison Officer.
- One Pre-shipment inspection was done at Koeberg and none at Necsa for this quarter.



VAALPUTS OPERATIONS

- Three concrete waste shipments (5 containers per shipment) were received from Koeberg for disposal.
- Five concrete waste shipments (6 containers per shipment) were received from Necsa for disposal.
- All waste packages complied with the Vaalputs Waste Acceptance Criteria for disposal.
- The annual inspection on the firefighting equipment was done by Boleng Fire Appliances.
- All statutory training for staff are up to date.



VAALPUTS OPERATIONS

- All waste packages were covered with screened clay to comply to NIL-28 conditions.
- Statutory inspections were done on all statutory equipment. No non-compliances were identified.
- All quarterly environmental samples were taken as required by the Nuclear Licence conditions.
- All radiological measurements were done in accordance with RP programme.
- The NNR conducted their quarterly compliance assurance inspection from 17-19 August 2021.

UPDATE ON VAALPUTS NUCLEAR INSTALLATION LICENCE APPLICATION



- The public participation process for NRWDI's Nuclear Installation License (NIL) application and Public Information Document (PID) was concluded on 30th March 2021.
- The NNR received a total of 71 comments on the PID from 11 respondents.
- None of the respondents opposed NRWDI's NIL application.
- NRWDI addressed all the public comments and updated the PID based on the comments received.
- The PID was also translated into Afrikaans.
- NRWDI is now waiting for the NNR's response and further direction for completion of the licencing process.

PRACTICAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR BOREHOLE DISPOSAL FACILITY (BDF)



- Ministerial approval was obtained on 14 June 2021 to enter into "Practical Arrangements between the IAEA and NRWDI on the cooperation in the area of the safe and secure Borehole Disposal of Disused Sealed Radioactive Sources".
- Practical Arrangements was signed on the margins of General Conference on 22 September 2021.



COVID-19 SAFETY



- Wear a mask that covers you nose and mouth.
- Keep a safe distance from others.
- Stay away form closed or crowded spaces.
- Wash your hands regularly with soap or sanitizer.
- Stay home if you are not feeling well.
